## Homage to Dr. Jagannath Wani

Our founding member and mentor passed away May 5, 2017.

Overcoming many personal adversities, Dr. Wani, Wani kaka to many of us, relentlessly worked, here and in India, to build an organization to advance the cause of the poor and disadvantaged hard-working people, who want to advance themselves and obtain their basic rights to have food, shelter and education.

Since the founding of MSSO, a charitable organization in Canada 28 years ago, MSSO has supported over 30 major projects, mainly in Maharashtra, India. Wani kaka identified projects and project teams that have an outlook consistent with MSSO's aims. He guided them to develop sustainable projects and he raised funds to support them. Wani kaka has left us, but his

work must continue. Our homage to him will be to ensure that the MSSO projects continue to grow and serve the people in need.

## Projects we supported in 2017

MSSO raised over \$5,00,000 through your donations and matching grants from the governments of Alberta and Canada. These funds were sent to various NG O's

working for the projects in Maharashtra and Goa, India.

Here are some of the projects MSSO supported in 2017,

## Blind ness Prevention Program for school children and adults in Dhule

The Canadian Government supported with matching donations over 360,000 vision-care screenings which were given to school children in rural areas of Dhule district. This 5-year project has surpassed its target, by almost 10-fold. Over 8,000 prescription glasses were distributed and over 1800 corrective surgeries, such as for cataract and squints were performed to help children and old people from villages.

The Govt. of Canada funding support for this project has come to an end, however MSSO endeavors to continue its support for 2018 and hopefully, beyond.

## AVANI Projects for the educational support of children of migrant workers in Kolhapur,

There are many migrant and seasonal workers who come to Kolhapur to work in brickyards and sugarcane fields. They must live in huts where they work. In the past, their children have had no access to education and eventually start work as child labourers. AVANI operates a residential facility for children who want education and cannot live with their parents AVANI also operates over 26 schools for migrant workers pre-school children and provides health and nutritional support.

## AVANI Zero-Waste project

This project is sometimes referred to as the "Ragpickers" project. All urban areas are facing mounting garbage Problems. Some of the most disadvantaged women work at the dumps to salvage recyclable materials to earn a living. They work without any protection, in the most hazardous foul environment. AVAN I has organized these "rag-pickers". They are given IDs, uniforms, safety equipment and a small remuneration. They work in areas assigned to them in a safer and dignified work environment.

## Schizophrenia Awareness Association (SAA), Pune,

SAA is dedicated to serving and advocating people with various levels of disability such as bi polar disorder or schizophrenia. At their facility in Pune, programs are offered to school children and adults who need support in coping with their disability.

Maiboli, School for Deaf and Mute Children, Samata Pratisthan, Yeola

This residential school is attended by over 110 deaf and mute children and run by Samata Pratishtan in Yeola. The students are provided with educational programs and the vocational training. Building construction for a new school facility which was supported by MSSO, is nearing completion. Samata Pratisthan provides valuable services to Children with disability.

### · SethuTrust, Goa,

The Sethu Trust organization provides support for children afflicted with developmental, behavioural, emotional and educational challenges. Sethu also provides valuable help to children's families. Sethu trust is planning to move to a permanent facility at a convenient location. MSSO is actively supporting this project.

## Help

MSSO has contributed to the projects executed by "Health and Education for Less Privileged" (HELP) society based in Calgary and founded by DR. Wani. HELP has supported the Samta Pratishtan Project in Yeola in 2017.
